- (1) COMMISSION MEMBERS <u>APPOINTED BY THE MAYOR</u> SERVE FOR A TERM OF 4 YEARS,
 CONCURRENT WITH THE TERMS <u>TERM</u> OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COUNCIL. <u>THE</u>
 <u>MEMBER APPOINTED FROM THE CITY COUNCIL SERVES FOR A TERM CONCURRENT</u>
 WITH THAT MEMBER'S TERM ON THE CITY COUNCIL.
- 7 (2) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS
 8 APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.
- 9 (B) COMPENSATION; EXPENSES.
- 10 MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION:
- 11 (1) ARE NOT ENTITLED TO COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES; BUT
