17 18	(1) "Consignment goods dealer" means any person receiving consignment goods for the purpose of selling them.
19 20	(2) "Consignment goods" includes all categories of moveable personal property enumerated in subsections (b) and (f) of this section.

22 23 24 25 26	"Second-hand personal property dealer" means any person engaged in the business of buying for resale, trade, or transfer used or previously owned property or merchandise, including, but not limited to, clothes, furniture, household items, MOTOR VEHICLE PARTS, and other moveable personal property, BUT excluding motor vehicles, records, tapes, compact discs, and books.
27 28 29	<b>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED</b> , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
