12	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That, in
13	accordance with Article V, § 5(b) of the City Charter, the City Comptroller may sell, at either
14	public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore in the property
15	known as 101 South Ellwood Avenue (Block 1752, Lot 1/54), and more particularly described as
16	follows:
17	The property is zoned R-8 and is located in the Highlandtown/Patterson Park
18	National Register Historic District. The improvements on the property consist of
19	the former Highlandtown Middle School, a 259,000+/- gross square foot
20	building, completed in 1932, that is currently vacant,
21	with the property containing 1.16+/- acres (50,587 square feet), more or less, this property being
22	no longer needed for public use.
23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance
24	unless the deed has been approved by the City Solicitor.
25	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it
