11 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That, in 12 accordance with Article V, § 5(b) of the City Charter, the City Comptroller may sell, at either 13 public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore in the property 14 known as 101 South Ellwood Avenue (Block 1752, Lot 1/54), and more particularly described as 15 follows:

- 16 The property is zoned R-8 and is located in the Highlandtown/Patterson Park
- 17 National Register Historic District. The improvements on the property consist of
- 18 the former Highlandtown Middle School, a 259,000+/- gross square foot
- building, completed in 1932, that is currently vacant,
- with the property containing 1.16+/- acres (50,587 square feet), more or less, this property being
 no longer needed for public use.
- 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance 23 unless the deed has been approved by the City Solicitor.
- SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is enacted.
