12 13	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

15	Article 26. Surveys, Streets, and Highways
16	Subtitle 18. Grades, Grading, and Paving
17	§ 18-11. "BIKE-SAFE" GRATES REQUIRED.
18	(a) City contracts
19	No contracts may be made by the City for paving or repaving any street,
20	AVENUE, LANE, OR ALLEY WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS UNLESS THE CONTRACT REQUIRES
21	THAT ALL DRAINAGE GRATES IN THE AFFECTED AREA BE PLACED SO THAT THE GAPS
22	BETWEEN THE BARS ON THE GRATES ARE PERPENDICULAR TO THE DIRECTION OF TRAFFIC.

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1	(B) GENERAL PAVING
2	No paving project may be permitted on any street, avenue, lane, or alley
3	WITHIN THE CITY UNLESS THE PERSON UNDERTAKING THE PROJECT ENSURES THAT ALL
4	DRAINAGE GRATES IN THE AFFECTED AREA ARE PLACED SO THAT THE GAPS BETWEEN THE
5	BARS ON THE GRATES ARE PERPENDICULAR TO THE DIRECTION OF TRAFFIC.
6	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
7	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
8	Ordinance.
9	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 <sup>th</sup> day
10	after the date it is enacted.
