BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the 12 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows: **Baltimore City Code** 13 Article 31. Transit and Traffic 14 Subtitle 6. Parking, Standing, and Stopping Regulations 15 Part 1. Method of Parking 16 § 6-3. Obstructing free passage. 17 (A) 2-WAY STREETS. 18 [No] ON A 2-WAY STREET, NO vehicle [shall] MAY be [so] parked, LEFT STANDING, or 19 otherwise stopped so as to prevent the free passage of other vehicles or street cars [in 20 both directions at the same time]. 21

(B) 1-WAY STREETS.

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- ON A 1-WAY STREET, NO VEHICLE MAY BE PARKED, LEFT STANDING, OR OTHERWISE
  STOPPED SO AS TO PREVENT THE FREE PASSAGE OF OTHER VEHICLES OR STREET CARS IN
  THE 1-WAY TRAVEL LANE.
- 5 (C) EXCEPTION FOR ALLEYS.
- 6A vehicle parked, standing, or stopped in an alley is not obstructing free7Passage through the alley, and is not subject to a fine or impoundment, if it is8Parked, standing, or stopped so that it leaves a 10-foot wide or wider travel9Lane through the alley for another vehicle.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
 Ordinance.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day
 after the date it is enacted.
