17	SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the

23	In case of any surplus arising in any fiscal year by reason of an excess of revenue over

25	surplus shall become a part of the general revenue of the City and shall be available for	
26	the general expenditures of the City for the next fiscal year, in accordance with the

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Ordinance of Estimates for that year. An estimate of [such] THE surplus shall be made by 1 the Board of Estimates and included in expected revenues for the next year. 2 However any surplus or retained earnings of the water or sanitary wastewater utility fund 3 (under [Section] § 18 of this article) at the end of the fiscal year shall remain to the credit 4 of that utility, and the estimate of [such a] THAT balance shall be included in that utility's 5 budget for the next year as an estimated receipt. 6 [(e) Surpluses – Capital Bond Fund Appropriation Reduction Account. 7 Except for the funds of the water or sanitary wastewater utilities, if at the end of any 8 fiscal year it is determined that there is any surplus in excess of the amount included in 9 expected revenues for the next fiscal year and such amount exceeds 1% of the General 10 Fund operating budget adopted for the next fiscal year and such amount does not include 11 any appropriation carried forward from the prior fiscal year, the excess of such General 12 Fund surplus over 1% of the operating budget shall be credited to an account known as 13 the "Capital Bond Fund Appropriation Reduction Account". 14 Funds in this account shall be allocated and paid by order of the Board of Finance for the 15 purpose of substituting for a like amount of general obligation bond funds for which 16 appropriations have been previously made by the Mayor and City Council; to the extent 17 that funds from the capital bond fund appropriation reduction account are utilized, the 18 authorized amount of general obligation bonds shall be automatically reduced. In 19 determining the application of such funds the Board of Finance shall be guided by the 20 conditions of the bond market and the financial interests of the City of Baltimore. 21 Funds in the capital bond fund appropriation reduction account not utilized in the first 22 year in which they are identified shall be carried forward at the end of the fiscal year to 23 be used for the purpose of substituting for general obligation bond funds at the earliest 24 practical time. Such funds shall be utilized only for the purpose for which the bond funds 25 26 were appropriated and may not be transferred directly or indirectly to any other purpose. Surplus funds exceeding the amount used in the revenue estimates for the succeeding 27 year but not in excess of 1% of the current General Fund operating budget may be 28 utilized by the Board of Estimates to reduce the tax rate requirements for the next fiscal 29 year or to constitute a source of funds for supplemental appropriations recommended to 30 the City Council pursuant to the provisions of this subsection.] 31
