## **AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING**

### **Transit and Traffic – Bike Lanes**

2	FOR the purpose of allowing the creation of bike lanes; defining certain terms; prohibiting
3	parking or standing in bike lanes; requiring bike-safe grates in bike lanes; imposing certain

- parking or standing in bike lanes; requiring bike-safe grates in bike lanes; imposing certain penalties: and generally relating to bike lanes on City streets.

- SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the 16 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows: 17

20	SUBTITLE 20. BIKE LANES
21	§ 20-1. DEFINITIONS.
22	(A) IN GENERAL.
23	IN THIS SUBTITLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS indicate matter added to existing law. [Brackets] indicate matter deleted from existing law. Underlining indicates matter added to the bill by amendment. Strike out indicates matter stricken from the bill by amendment or deleted from existing law by amendment.

- 1 (B) *BIKE LANE*.
- 2 "Bike Lane" means a portion of a City street designated exclusively for <del>the</del>
  3 single directional bicycle flow <del>of non-motorized vehicles</del>.
- 4 (C) DIRECTOR.
- 5 "DIRECTOR" MEANS THE DIRECTOR OF TRANSPORTATION.

### 6 § 20-2 RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- 7 (A) DOT TO ADOPT.
- 8 The Director may adopt rules and regulations to implement this subtitle.
- 9 (B) FILING WITH LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE.
- 10A COPY OF ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE MUST BE FILED11WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BEFORE THEY BECOME EFFECTIVE.
- 12 § 20-3. DESIGNATION OF BIKE LANES.
- 13 THE DIRECTOR MAY DESIGNATE 4' TO 5' WIDE STRIPS ON CITY STREETS AS BIKE LANES.
- 14 § 20-54. MARKINGS.
- 15 (A) *ON STREET*.
- 16(1)Bike lanes must be clearly marked on the street with 2 solid white lines17AND A BIKE SYMBOL IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF18TRANSPORTATION'S FEDERAL HIGHWAY ADMINISTRATION MANUAL ON UNIFORM19TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES OR OTHER NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED STANDARDS.
- 20 (2) MATERIALS FOR MARKING BIKE LANES MUST BE SELECTED TO MINIMIZE THE LOSS OF 21 TRACTION FOR BICYCLES IN WET CONDITIONS.
- 22 (B) *SIGNAGE*.
- 23 (1) Signs must be installed marking the beginning and ending of a bike lane.
- 24 (2) SIGNS MAY BE INSTALLED TO INDICATE THE CONTINUATION OF A BIKE LANE.
- 25 (3) THESE SIGNS MUST:
- 26(i) BE IN A FORM APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS27IMPLEMENTING THIS SUBTITLE; AND
- 28 (II) INDICATE THAT PARKING OR STANDING IS PROHIBITED IN A BIKE LANE.

1	THE APPLICATION AND PLACEMENT OF SIGNS MARKING BIKE LANES MUST CONFORM TO
2	<u>the United States Department of Transportation's Federal Highway</u>
3	Administration Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
4	§ 20-4 <u>5</u> . Bike lane parking restrictions.
5	No motor vehicle may park or stand in an area designated and marked as a bike
6	LANE.
7	§§ 20-6 то 20-7. <i>{Reserved}</i>
8	§ 20-8. "Bike-safe" grates required.
9	After an area has been designated as a bike lane by the Director, <u>the Director</u>

- 5 (3) Standing within 15 feet of a fire plug or fire hydrant in violation of § 6-6(a) {"Engine hydrants"} of this article is punishable by a fine of \$75.
- 7 (4) Stopping in front of or opposite a fire engine house in violation of § 6-6(c) {"Engine houses"} of this article is punishable by a fine of \$75.
- 9 (5) Stopping or parking in a transit stop is punishable by a fine of \$75.
- (6) Parking or standing a noncommercial vehicle of more than 20,000 pounds gross weight
   or a commercial vehicle of 20,000 pounds or less gross weight in violation of § 6-26(c)
   {"Nighttime hours"} of this article is punishable by a fine of \$75.
- 13 (7) PARKING OR STANDING IN A BIKE LANE IN VIOLATION OF § 20-5 {"BIKE LANE PARKING
   14 RESTRICTIONS"} OF THIS ARTICLE IS PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF \$75.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
 Ordinance.

18 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day 19 after the date it is enacted.
