AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

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Scrap Metal Processors Dealers – Conformance to State Law

- For the purpose of repealing certain provisions that have been preempted by State law; formally
 designating, as required by State law, the City's "primary enforcement unit" to receive
- 4 certain records; conforming a definition to its State law counterpart; <u>modifying and</u>
- 5 conforming certain nomenclature for clarity; exempting certain otherwise-licensed activities;
- 6 clarifying the need of scrap metal processors <u>dealers</u> to comply with State licensing and
- 7 regulatory provisions; authorizing the denial, suspension, or refusal to renew certain licenses
- 8 for violation of certain State laws, rules, or regulations; providing for a special effective date;
- 9 and generally relating to the licensing and regulation of scrap metal processors <u>dealers</u>.

The Police Commissioner may deny, suspend, revoke, or refuse to renew a license if, after
 giving the applicant or licensee notice and an opportunity to be heard, the Police
 Commissioner finds that the applicant or licensee:

- (1) has made a material misstatement or omission in any application for an initial or
 renewal license;
- 17 (2) HAS FAILED TO MAINTAIN IN GOOD STANDING ITS STATE LICENSE UNDER STATE
 18 BUSINESS REGULATION ARTICLE TITLE 17, SUBTITLE 10 {"JUNK DEALERS AND SCRAP METAL PROCESSORS"} ANY STATE LICENSE REQUIRED FOR THE BUSINESS;

30A person aggrieved by a decision of the Police Commissioner under [§ 8-13.1] § 8-1131{"Denial, suspension, etc., of license"} of this subtitle may seek judicial review of that32decision by petition to the Circuit Court for Baltimore City in accordance with the33Maryland Rules of Procedure.
