I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 10-0620.

The purpose of this bill is to clarify the legal responsibilities of the Departments of Public Works and Transportation for the review of plot plans for parking lots.

The Department of Transportation (DOT) supports City Council Bill 10-0620 with amendments. DOT understands that this bill is intended to correct terms associated with plot plan review so that the law requires what actually occurs. On March 17, 2003, Ordinance 03-501 established a new "Department of Transportation," and placed all transportation-related responsibilities under the purview of that Department, instead of the Department of Public Works, which held those responsibilities previously. However, several areas of the Baltimore City Code still reference the Department of Public Works for responsibilities that now actually fall under DOT's duties and powers. This bill attempts to address such errors found in the City Code section requiring government review of plot plans for projects providing for 5 or more new parking spaces.

For the most part, the bill is accurate. However, the Department of Public Works still oversees stormwater run-off and wastewater management. Therefore, DOT suggests the following amendments:

§ 10-301. Plot plan.

- (c) Required reviews.
 - (1) If a proposed new or expanded use provides for 5 or more new parking spaces, the Zoning Administrator must forward the plot plan for that use to:
 - (i) the Department of Planning; and
 - (ii) the Department of [Public Works]; AND

(III) THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

- (2) The Department of Public Works Transportation must determine:
 - (i) compliance with:
 - (A) drainage requirements;
 - (B) sidewalk, curb, and driveway requirements; and
 - $(\mathbf{E}\mathbf{B})$ other relevant standards adopted by the Department of Public Works Transportation; and.

(3) THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION MUST DETERMINE:

(ii) the adequacy of:

- (A) ingress and egress provisions for vehicular movement;
- (B) safety provisions for pedestrian and vehicular traffic; and
- (C) all safeguards needed to ensure a minimum of disruption to public rights-of-way and a maximum of safety-: AND

(II) COMPLIANCE WITH SIDEWALK, CURB AND DRIVEWAY REQUIREMENTS.

(3) Within 10 days of their having received the plot plan, the Department of Planning, and the Department of {Public Works}, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION must return the plot plan to the Zoning Administrator, with their written approvals or recommended modifications.
