9	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the

17	(1) If a proposed new or expanded use provides for 5 or more new parking spaces, the

16 17 18 19	(4) (3) Within 10 days of their having received the plot plan, the Department of Planning, and the Department of [Public Works], AND THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION must return the plot plan to the Zoning Administrator, with their written approvals or recommended modifications.
