City Council Bill 12-0038 - Zoning - Conditional Use Convalescent, Nursing, and Rest

Home (Substance Abuse Treatment Center) - 4613 Park Heights Avenue

The Department of Housing and Community Development has reviewed City Council Bill 12-0038, which was introduced for the purpose of permitting, subject to certain conditions, the establishment, maintenance, and operation of a convalescent, nursing, and rest home (substance abuse treatment center) on the property known as 4613 Park Heights Avenue, as outlined in red on the accompanying plat.

This bill would authorize a conditional use on the subject property to construct a three-story building for women and children currently being served by Gaudenzia, Inc. at an existing building on the adjacent 4615 Park Heights Avenue. The second- and third-floors of the subject property will have eighteen (18) dwelling units where women who have successfully graduated from a substance abuse recovery program will be able to live, along with their children.

The Department of Housing and Community Development has no objection to City Council Bill 12-0038 provided any concerns raised by the Department of Planning and/or the Board of Municipal and Zoning
