#### 12 **SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the 13 City Charter is proposed to be amended to read as follows:

# **Baltimore City Charter**

- Article IV. Mayor
- 16 § 8. Minority party representation.

Except as otherwise provided in the Charter or by other law, at least one member, in the case of commissions or boards composed of not more than five members, and at least two members, in the case of commissions or boards composed of more than five members, shall be registered voters [of the minority party] in Baltimore City WHO ARE NOT REGISTERED AS MEMBERS OF THE MAJORITY PARTY. The ["minority party"] "MAJORITY PARTY" shall be that political party which had the [second] largest number of registered voters at the time of the municipal election next preceding the date of the appointment.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment to the City
 Charter be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City, for adoption or rejection,
 in accordance with Article XI-A, § 5 of the Maryland Constitution, in the form specified by the
 City Solicitor.
