### AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

#### Bond Issue - Community Development Loan - \$24,000,000

2 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore (pursuant to Resolution 3 III of 2012 approved by the members of the Maryland General Assembly representing 4 Baltimore City) to create a debt, and to issue and sell its certificates of indebtedness as 5 evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding \$24,000,000 from the sale of such certificates 6 of indebtedness to be used for the cost of issuance, including the expense of engraving, printing, advertising, attorneys' fees, and all other incidental expenses connected therewith, 7 8 and the remainder of such proceeds to be used for or in connection with planning, 9 developing, executing, and making operative the community development program of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, including, but not limited to, the acquisition, by 10 purchase, lease, condemnation or any other legal means, of land or property, or any right, 11 interest, franchise, easement or privilege therein, in the City of Baltimore; the payment of any 12 13 and all costs and expenses incurred in connection with or incidental to the acquisition and 14 management of said land or property, including any and all rights or interests therein hereinbefore mentioned; the development, or redevelopment, including, but not limited to, 15 the comprehensive renovation or rehabilitation of any land or property, or any rights or 16 interests therein hereinbefore mentioned, in the City of Baltimore, and the disposition of land 17 18 and property for such purposes; the elimination of unhealthful, unsanitary, or unsafe 19 conditions, lessening density, eliminating obsolete or other uses detrimental to the public welfare or otherwise removing or preventing the spread of blight or deterioration in the City 20 21 of Baltimore and the creation of healthy, sanitary, and safe, and green conditions in the City of Baltimore; the demolition, removal, relocation, renovation or alteration of land, buildings, 22 streets, highways, alleys, utilities or services, and other structures or improvements, and for 23 the construction and reconstruction, installation, relocation or repair of buildings, streets, 24 25 highways, alleys, utilities or services, and other structures or improvements; the payment of any and all costs and expenses incurred for or in connection with doing any or all of the 26 things herein mentioned, including, but not limited to, the costs and expenses of securing 27 administrative, appraisal, economic analysis, engineering, planning, designing, architectural, 28 surveying, and other professional services; and the lending or granting of funds to any person 29 30 or other legal entity to be used for or in connection with the rehabilitation, renovation, redevelopment, improvement or construction of buildings and structures located within the 31

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boundaries of Baltimore City, which buildings or structures are to be used or occupied for 1 2 residential or commercial purposes; and doing any and all things necessary, proper or 3 expedient in connection with or pertaining to any or all of the matters or things hereinbefore 4 mentioned; all such land or property shall be acquired, developed, redeveloped, renovated, 5 rehabilitated, altered, improved, held or disposed of, as provided by law; authorizing the 6 issuance of refunding bonds; conferring and imposing upon the Board of Finance of 7 Baltimore City certain powers and duties; authorizing the submission of this Ordinance to the 8 legal voters of the City of Baltimore, for their approval or disapproval, at the General Election to be held in Baltimore City, on Tuesday, the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2012; and 9 providing for the expenditure of the proceeds of sale of said certificates of indebtedness in 10 accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, 11 and by the municipal agency designated in the annual Ordinance of Estimates of the Mayor 12 and City Council of Baltimore. 13

WHEREAS, By Resolution III of 2012, approved by the members of the Maryland General Assembly representing Baltimore City, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore is authorized to create a debt and to issue and sell its certificates of indebtedness (hereinafter called "bonds") as evidence thereof, and proceeds not exceeding \$24,000,000 from the sale of such bonds to be used in connection with the community development program of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore as authorized by said Resolution; and

20 WHEREAS, Funds are now needed for said purposes; now, therefore,

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the 22 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Finance of said 23 municipality, be and it is hereby authorized and empowered to create a debt and to issue and sell bonds of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore from time to time, as may be needed or 24 required for the purposes hereinafter named and said bonds shall be sold by the Board of Finance 25 26 from time to time and at such times as shall be requisite, and proceeds not exceeding \$24,000,000 from the sale of such bonds shall be used for the purposes hereinafter named. 27 provided that this Ordinance shall not become effective unless it shall be approved by a majority 28 of the votes of the legal voters of Baltimore City cast at the time and place hereinafter designated 29 30 by this Ordinance.

31 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

(a) The denomination or denominations of the bonds to be issued at any particular time
 and the place or places for the payment of principal and interest thereof are to be determined by
 the Board of Finance.

(b) The bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this Ordinance
may be issued to mature on such dates and in such amounts as the Board of Finance may
determine; provided that the entire principal amount represented thereby shall be discharged not
more than 40 years from the date of issuance of the bonds.

(c) The bonds, when issued, shall bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined
by the Board of Finance, which rate or rates may be fixed or variable or as determined by a
method approved by the Board of Finance, and such interest shall be payable at such time or
times as may be determined by the Board of Finance.

1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That a majority of the Board of Finance of the 2 Mayor and City Council of Baltimore be, and they are hereby, authorized to pass a resolution or 3 resolutions, from time to time, to determine and set forth any or all of the following:

(a) The amount of debt to be incurred by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore at any
particular time, and from time to time, under and pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance;
the date or dates when any bonds representing said debt, or any part thereof, are to mature, and
the amount or amounts of said debt, or any part thereof, which shall mature upon the aforesaid
date or dates; and the date or dates in each year, during the entire period of time when any of said
bonds are outstanding, when interest on any of said bonds shall be payable;

(b) The form or forms of the bonds representing the debt, or any part thereof, authorized
 to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance at any particular time; and

(c) If the bonds are to be sold at public sale, the time, place, manner and medium of 12 advertisement of the readiness of the Board of Finance, acting for and on behalf of the Mayor and 13 14 City Council of Baltimore, to receive bids for the purchase of the bonds authorized to be issued 15 hereunder or any part thereof; the form, terms and conditions of such bids; the time, place and manner of awarding bonds so bid for, including the right whenever any of the bonds authorized 16 by this Ordinance are offered for sale and sold at the same time as other bonds of the City, to 17 establish the conditions for bids and awards and to award all of the bonds on an all or none basis. 18 19 and the time, place, terms and manner of settlement for the bonds so bid for; provided, however, 20 that notwithstanding anything in this section, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, or the 21 Board of Finance, as the case may be, shall have the right to reject any or all bids therefor for any 22 reason.

### 23 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

(a) All premiums resulting from the sale of any of the bonds issued and sold pursuant tothe provisions of this Ordinance shall be applied as directed by the Board of Finance.

(b) The debt authorized by the provisions of this Ordinance, and the bonds issued and
sold pursuant thereto and their transfer, and the principal and interest payable thereon (including
any profit made in the sale thereof), shall be and remain exempt from any and all State, county
and municipal taxation in the State of Maryland.

(c) All bonds issued and sold pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance may be sold at
 public sale by the solicitation of competitive bids or at private (negotiated) sale without
 advertisement or solicitation of competitive bids, for a price or prices which may be at, above or
 below par value of the bonds, as determined by resolution of the Board of Finance of the Mayor
 and City Council of Baltimore.

SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That until all of the interest on and principal of any bonds issued pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance have been paid in full, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall levy and impose an annual tax on each \$100 of assessable property in the City of Baltimore at a rate sufficient to produce revenue to pay all interest on and principal of all bonds theretofore issued and outstanding or authorized to be issued and outstanding, payable in the next succeeding year.

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1 **SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That this Ordinance shall be submitted to the 2 legal voters of the City of Baltimore, for their approval or disapproval, at the General Election to 3 be held in Baltimore City, on Tuesday, the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2012.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That prior to the date of the election hereinbefore mentioned, notice shall be given to the public of the amount of money which the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore is authorized to borrow, and the general purposes for which such borrowed funds may be expended, under the terms and provisions of this Ordinance, and the time when the election hereinbefore mentioned is to be held; and such public notice shall be given in such manner and by such means or through such media and at such time or times as may be determined, from time to time, by a majority of the Board of Finance.

SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the actual cash proceeds derived from the sale of the bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be used exclusively for the following purposes, to wit:

(a) So much thereof as may be necessary for the cost of issuance, including the expense of
engraving, printing, advertising, attorneys' fees, and all other incidental expenses connected
therewith (which may include the proportion of the compensation of employees and general
administrative expenses of the Department of Finance reasonably allocated to the issuance of the
bonds); and

(b) The remainder of such proceeds shall be used for or in connection with planning,
 developing, executing and making operative the community development program of the Mayor
 and City Council of Baltimore, including, but not limited to:

(i) The acquisition, by purchase, lease, condemnation, or any other legal means, of
 land or property, or any right, interest, franchise, easement or privilege therein, in the City of
 Baltimore;

(ii) The payment of any and all costs and expenses incurred in connection with or
 incidental to the acquisition and management of said land or property, including any and all
 rights or interests therein hereinbefore mentioned;

(iii) The development or redevelopment, including, but not limited to, the
comprehensive renovation or rehabilitation of any land or property, or any rights or interests
therein hereinbefore mentioned, in the City of Baltimore, and the disposition of land and property
for such purposes;

(iv) The elimination of unhealthful, unsanitary, or unsafe conditions, lessening
 density, eliminating obsolete or other uses detrimental to the public welfare or otherwise
 removing or preventing the spread of blight or deterioration in the City of Baltimore and the
 creation of healthy, sanitary, and safe, and green conditions in the City of Baltimore;

(v) The demolition, removal, relocation, renovation or alteration of land, buildings,
 streets, highways, alleys, utilities or services, and other structures or improvements, and for the
 construction and reconstruction, installation, relocation or repair of buildings, streets, highways,
 alleys, utilities or services, and other structures or improvements;

(vi) The payment of any and all costs and expenses incurred for or in connection with
 doing any or all of the things herein mentioned, including, but not limited to, the costs and
 expenses of securing administrative, appraisal, economic analysis, engineering, planning,
 designing, architectural, surveying, and other professional services; and

5 (vii) The lending or granting of funds to any person or other legal entity to be used for 6 or in connection with the rehabilitation, renovation, redevelopment, improvement or construction 7 of buildings and structures located within the boundaries of Baltimore City, which buildings or 8 structures are to be used or occupied for residential or commercial purposes; and

- 9 (viii) Doing any and all things necessary, proper or expedient in connection with or 10 pertaining to any or all of the matters or things hereinbefore mentioned.
- All such land or property shall be acquired, developed, redeveloped, renovated,
   rehabilitated, altered, improved, held or disposed of, as provided by law.
- 13 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That:

14 (a) The Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Finance 15 thereof, is hereby authorized and empowered to issue its bonds for the purpose of refunding any bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance by payment at maturity or 16 the purchase or redemption of bonds in advance of maturity. The validity of any refunding bonds 17 18 shall in no way be dependent upon or related to the validity or invalidity of the bonds being 19 refunded. Such refunding bonds may be issued by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by and through the Board of Finance thereof, for the purpose of providing it with funds to 20 pay any of its outstanding bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance at 21 maturity, to purchase in the open market any of its outstanding bonds authorized to be issued 22 under the provisions of this Ordinance prior to their maturity, to redeem prior to their maturity 23 24 any outstanding bonds which are, by their terms, redeemable, to pay interest on any outstanding bonds prior to their payment at maturity or purchase or redemption in advance of maturity, or to 25 26 pay any redemption or purchase premium in connection with the refunding of any of its 27 outstanding bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance.

- (b) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
   Ordinance may be issued for the public purpose of:
- (1) Realizing savings to Baltimore City in the aggregate cost of debt service on either
   a direct comparison or present value basis; or
- 32 (2) Debt restructuring that:
- 33 (i) In the aggregate effects such a reduction in the cost of debt service; or

(ii) Is determined by the Board of Finance of the Mayor and City Council of
Baltimore to be in the best interests of Baltimore City, to be consistent with Baltimore City's
long-term financial plan, and to realize a financial objective of Baltimore City including,
improving the relationship of debt service to a source of payment such as taxes, assessments, or
other charges.

1 (c) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this 2 Ordinance may be issued in whatever principal amount shall be required to achieve the purpose 3 for the issuance of the refunding bonds, which amount may be in excess of the principal amount 4 of the bonds refunded or the maximum principal amount of bonds authorized to be issued under 5 Section 1 of this Ordinance.

6 (d) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this 7 Ordinance may be issued to mature on such dates and in such amounts as the Board of Finance 8 may determine; provided that the entire principal amount represented by the refunding bonds 9 shall be discharged not more than 40 years from the date of issuance of the bonds being refunded.

(e) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
 Ordinance may be sold at public sale by the solicitation of competitive bids or at private
 (negotiated) sale without advertisement or solicitation of competitive bids, for a price or prices
 which may be at, above or below the par value of the refunding bonds, as determined by
 resolution of the Board of Finance of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

(f) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
Ordinance shall bear interest at such rate or rates as may be determined by the Board of Finance
of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, which rate or rates may be fixed or variable or as
determined by a method approved by the Board of Finance, and such interest shall be payable at
such time or times as may be determined by the Board of Finance.

(g) The proceeds of the sale of any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold
under the provisions of this Ordinance, after the payment of issuance costs relating thereto, shall
be set aside by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore as a separate trust fund to be used solely
for the purposes stated in this Section 9.

(h) Except as otherwise provided in this Section 9, the powers granted in, the limitations
and obligations imposed by, and the procedures specified in this Ordinance with respect to the
issuance of bonds shall be applicable to the issuance of refunding bonds.

(i) Any refunding bonds authorized to be issued and sold under the provisions of this
Ordinance shall not be subject to any debt policy limitation that may from time to time be
established by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.

**SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That the expenditure of the proceeds derived from the sale of the bonds authorized to be issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Charter of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, and by the municipal agency designated in the annual Ordinance of Estimates of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore.
