11 12	SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE , That the City Charter is proposed to be amended to read as follows:	
13	Baltimore City Charter	
14	Article IV. Mayor	
15	§ 8. Minority party representation.	
16	Except as otherwise provided in the Charter or by other law, at least one member, in the case	
17	of commissions or boards composed of not more than five members, and at least two	
18	members, in the case of commissions or boards composed of more than five members, shall	
19	be registered voters [of the minority party] in Baltimore City WHO ARE NOT REGISTERED AS	
20	MEMBERS OF THE MAJORITY PARTY. The ["minority party"] "MAJORITY PARTY" shall be that	
21	political party which had the [second] largest number of registered voters at the time of the	
22	municipal election next preceding the date of the appointment.	
23	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That this proposed amendment to the City	
24	Charter be submitted to the legal and qualified voters of Baltimore City, for adoption or rejection,	
25	in accordance with Article XI-A, § 5 of the Maryland Constitution, in the form specified by the	
26	City Solicitor.
