On July 16, 2012 the Baltimore City Council introduced the above-captioned resolution, regarding a request that the city's five largest agencies sponsor two recreation centers each to continue operations of recreation centers slated for closure or private partnerships after the 2012 summer season.

Although Baltimore City Public Schools (City Schools) is not among the agencies listed in the resolution, five of our schools are already involved in supporting recreational activities throughout the city. Participating schools provide space and programming for a range of after-school programs run by the above-listed community organizations. City Schools will continue to support such efforts to offer safe recreational activities after school whenever possible.
