Appropriation – Department of Transportation \$ 7,200,000.00

HISTORY: On September 9, 2012, the Board of Estimates recommended the supplementary general fund capital appropriation to the Department of Transportation for \$7,200,000.00.

CONFORMITY TO PLANS – This plan is consistent with the Comprehensive Master Plan's LIVE section, Goal 3: Improve Transportation Access, Accessibility and Choice for City Residents. Objective 1: Create a Comprehensive Transportation Plan to Improve Mobility, Accessibility and Choice

ANALYSIS

City Council Bill 12-0141 is for the approval of supplement general fund capital appropriations to the Department of Transportation (9950-903550-9509). This request for additional appropriations is necessary to allow the General Funds to be appropriated by the City.

The Fiscal Year 2012 Ordinance of Estimates, recommended by the Board of Estimates and approved by the City Council, authorizes all expenditures of funds for the fiscal year. However the city realized greater than anticipated revenue from Highway User Revenue in FY 2012. This additional revenue could not have been anticipated when the Ordinance of Estimates for Fiscal Year 2013 was formulated. This supplementary appropriation provides funding for additional neighborhood street resurfacing, facility replacement and project planning and design.

Staff has notified the Department of Transportation of this action.
