AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

1	Burglar Alarms – No Fees For User Registrations
2	FOR the purpose of specifying that a burglar alarm user may not be charged a fee for registering
3	an alarm with the Police Commissioner, lowering the fines for burglar alarm violations,
4	redefining certain terms, moving legal responsibility for the burglar alarm registration
5	program from the Police Commissioner to the Housing Commissioner, requiring more
6	frequent reporting, requiring that notice of the burglar alarm registration requirements be
7	provided to consumers, clarifying and conforming related provisions, and generally relating
8	to the registration and regulation of burglar alarms.

19	(j) User.	
20	(1) "User" means, except as specified in paragraph (2) of this subsection:	
21	(i) the owner or lessee of any alarm system;	
22 23	(ii) the owner or lessee of any dwelling unit, place of business, or other premises that has been equipped with an alarm system; or	
24	(iii) any other person that uses an alarm system.	
25	(2) "User" does not include:	
26 27	(I) the owner or manager of a multi-tenant building with respect to any alarm system that is used solely by a tenant of that building; or	
28 29	(II) A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY OR AN INSTRUMENTALITY OR UNIT OF A GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY.	

1	§ 8-3. Registration — Contractors.
2	(a) Registration required.
3	An alarm system contractor must register with the Commissioner before undertaking to
4	install, maintain, alter, inspect, administer, sell, or service any alarm system in Baltimore
5	<u>City.</u>
6	(B) REGISTRATION UPDATES REQUIRED.
7	AN ALARM SYSTEM CONTRACTOR MUST KEEP ITS REGISTRATION WITH THE COMMISSIONER
8	CURRENT BY, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE UNDERTAKING, REPORTING TO THE COMMISSIONER,
9	ON A FORM APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER, WHENEVER IT UNDERTAKES TO INSTALL,
10	MAINTAIN, ALTER, INSPECT, ADMINISTER, SELL, OR SERVICE ANY ALARM SYSTEM IN
11	BALTIMORE CITY.
12	[(b)] (c) Violations.
13	For purposes of the penalties imposed by this subtitle, each event that violates this section
14	constitutes a separate offense.
15	§ 8-4. Registration — Monitors.
16	(a) Registration required.
17	An alarm system monitor must register with the Commissioner before undertaking to
18	monitor any alarm system in Baltimore City.
19	(B) REGISTRATION UPDATES REQUIRED.
20	AN ALARM SYSTEM MONITOR MUST KEEP ITS REGISTRATION WITH THE COMMISSIONER
21	CURRENT BY, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE UNDERTAKING, REPORTING TO THE COMMISSIONER,
22	ON A FORM APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER, WHENEVER IT UNDERTAKES TO MONITOR
23	ANY ALARM SYSTEM IN BALTIMORE CITY.
24	[(b)] (C) Violations.
25	For purposes of the penalties imposed by this subtitle, each contract by an unregistered
26	alarm system monitor on behalf of an alarm system user constitutes a separate offense.
27	§ 8-5. Registration — Users.
28	(a) Registration required.
29	An alarm system user must:
30	(1) register with the Commissioner [before the user's alarm system causes contact
31	with police or results in a police response at the user's property] WITHIN 10 DAYS
32	OF ACTIVATING AN ALARM SYSTEM; AND

1 2 3	(2) UPDATE THE REGISTRATION, WITHIN 10 DAYS OF ANY CHANGE, IF ANY INFORMATION THE COMMISSIONER REQUIRES ON THE REGISTRATION FORM CHANGES AFTER THE REGISTRATION IS FILED.
4	(C) NO REGISTRATION FEE FOR USERS.
5	A USER MAY NOT BE CHARGED ANY FEES FOR REGISTRATIONS OR RENEWALS OF REGISTRATIONS REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION.
7	§ 8-6. Notices and reports.
8	(a) Notice to user.
9 10	(1) Any person who sells or leases alarm systems must post conspicuously in that person's place of business notice of a user's obligation to register under this subtitle.
11 12 13 14	(2) [If a sale or lease transaction occurs outside the person's place of business, or if the person does not maintain a place of business in a commercial establishment, this notice must be provided] ANY PERSON WHO SELLS OR LEASES ALARM SYSTEMS MUST PROVIDE PRINTED NOTICE to the user, [in writing,] before the user takes possession of the system, OF:
16	(I) THE USER'S OBLIGATION TO REGISTER UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, AND
17 18	(II) THE CONTACT INFORMATION PROVIDED BY THE COMMISSIONER FOR THE OFFICE WHERE THE USER CAN REGISTER THE ALARM SYSTEM.
19 20 21	(3) The wording, size, and placement of the [notice] NOTICES REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION must comply with the rules and regulations adopted by the Commissioner under this subtitle.
22	(b) Reports to Commissioner — unmonitored systems.
23 24	(1) If the person selling or leasing an alarm system is not under contract to monitor that system, the person must report the transaction to the Commissioner.
25	(2) This report must:
26	(i) be made within 10 days of the sale or lease; and
27	(ii) contain:
28	(A) the user's name, address, and telephone number;
29	(B) the make and model of the system; and
30	(C) any other information that the Commissioner requires.

1	(c) Reports to Commissioner — monitored systems.		
2 3 4	(1) Each monitor doing business in the City must provide the Commissioner with [an annual] A MONTHLY report of all users in the City to whom the monitor is then providing services.		
5 6 7	(2) EACH MONITOR DOING BUSINESS IN THE CITY MUST PROVIDE THE COMMISSION WITH ADDITIONAL UPDATED REPORTS OF ALL USERS IN THE CITY TO WHOM THE MONITOR IS THEN PROVIDING SERVICES UPON THE COMMISSIONER'S REQUEST.	<u> R</u>
