4	EACH REPORT SHALL BE SUBMITTED ON A QUARTER-ANNUAL BASIS, WITHIN 30 DAYS
5	AFTER THE END OF EACH QUARTER, FOR THE QUARTERS ENDING SEPTEMBER 30,
6	DECEMBER 31, MARCH 31, AND JUNE 30 OF EACH FISCAL YEAR.
7	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That: the first quarterly report under Article 31,
8	§ 16-24(d), as enacted by this Ordinance, shall be for the full quarter beginning January 1, 2013,
9	and ending June 30, 2013.
10	(1) two initial periodic reports under this Ordinance shall be submitted as follows:
11	(i) the first report shall be submitted, within 30 days after the effective date of
12	this Ordinance, for the period beginning July 1, 2012, and ending on the
13	effective date of this Ordinance; and
14	(ii) a second report shall be submitted, within 30 days after June 30, 2013, for the
15	period beginning the day after the effective date of this Ordinance and ending
16	June 30, 2013; and
17	(2) all subsequent reports shall be submitted in accordance with the reporting periods
18	specified in Article 31, § 16-24(d), as enacted by this Ordinance.
19	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
20	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
21	Ordinance.
22	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day
23	after the date it is enacted.
