> Re: City Council Bill 12-0155 - Stormwater Remediation Fees

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 12-0155 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill imposes a stormwater remediation fee to fund the costs of the City's stormwater management system. The bill provides for the setting of rates and calculation of the fee; provides for the establishment of a system of credits; provides for the collection and enforcement of the fee; specifies the uses to which the proceeds of the fee may be expended and the accounting and expenditure system for the stormwater utility; defines certain terms; prohibits certain conduct; and imposes certain penalties. The bill provides for a special effective date, which is July1, 2013.

State law, specifically Section 4-202.1 of the Environmental Article, provides for local stormwater remediation fees, along with a local stormwater restoration fund. According to the State law, the stormwater remediation fee must be based on the share of the stormwater management services related to a given property and can be set as a flat rate, a graduated rate that accounts for the amount of impervious surface on a property, or based on any other method of calculation. The State law establishes that certain properties are exempt from the fee, but allows for specified fee reductions and the granting of local exemptions, including a financial hardship exemption. Furthermore, the State law allows for local policies and procedures to determine guidelines and procedures relating to the imposed fees. The State law requires the money deposited in the local stormwater restoration fund be spent only for certain specified purposes. Furthermore, the State prohibits money in the fund from reverting or being transferred to the general fund.

Council Bill 12-0155 satisfies the State law requirements. As there are no legal impediments to the adoption of this bill, the Law Department approves it for form and legal sufficiency as drafted.
