- FOR the purpose of authorizing waste haulers to apply for either an annual license or a 90-day
 license from the Health Commissioner; correcting, clarifying, and conforming related

15 **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE**, That the 16 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

1	§ 7-205.	In general.	
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2 3	No person may operate as a hauler in the City without a license to do so from the Commissioner of Health.
4	§ 7-208. Issuance of license.
5	The Commissioner must issue a license to the applicant if the applicant:
6	(1) has complied with all applicable laws, rules, and regulations; and
7	(2) pays the applicable license fee.
8	§ 7-209 Term and renewal of license.
9	(a) Term of license.
10 11	(1) AN APPLICANT MAY, AT THE APPLICANT'S OPTION, APPLY FOR EITHER AN ANNUAL LICENSE OR A 90-DAY LICENSE.
12	(2) Unless sooner suspended or revoked[,]:
13 14	(I) [a] AN ANNUAL license expires on [December 31 of each year] ON THE 1 ST ANNUAL ANNIVERSARY OF ITS ISSUANCE; AND
15	(II) A 90-DAY LICENSE EXPIRES ON THE 90^{TH} day after its issuance.
16	(b) Application for renewal.
17 18	Before a license expires, the licensee periodically may renew the license for an additional 1-year OR 90-DAY term, AS THE CASE MAY BE, if the licensee:
19	(1) otherwise is entitled to a license;
20 21	(2) submits a renewal application to the Commissioner, on the form that the Commissioner provides; and
22	(3) pays the applicable [annual] fee.
23	§ 7-210. License fees.
24	(a) In general.
25 26	The fees to be charged under this subtitle are as set by the Commissioner, with the approval of the Board of Estimates.

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1	(b) [Small haulers] DIFFERENTIALS.
2	The fees so set:
3	(1) MUST INCLUDE AN PRO RATED DIFFERENTIAL FOR 90-DAY LICENSES; AND
4	(2) may include an appropriate differential for small haulers.
5 6 7	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
8 9	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
