11	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the
12	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

14	Article 5. Finance, Property, and Procurement
15	Subtitle 28. Minority and Women's Business Enterprises
16	§ 28-6. Automatic termination.
17	This subtitle automatically expires on [December 31, 2013] APRIL 30, 2014, unless the City
18	Council, after causing an appropriate study to be undertaken, conducting public hearings, and
19	hearing testimonial evidence, finds that the purposes identified in this subtitle have not yet been
20	achieved, in which case this subtitle may be extended for 5 more years.
21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
22	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
23	Ordinance.
