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1	§ 15. GENERAL COUNSEL.
2	(A) AUTHORITY TO EMPLOY.
3 4 5 6	BY RESOLUTION, THE THE CITY COUNCIL MAY EMPLOY OR CONTRACT FOR THE SERVICES OF AN INDEPENDENT GENERAL COUNSEL. THE SELECTION AND EMPLOYMENT OF THE GENERAL COUNSEL SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH THIS SECTION, AS SUPPLEMENTED BY THE RULES OF THE CITY COUNCIL.
7	(B) QUALIFICATIONS.
8	THE GENERAL COUNSEL:
9	(1) MUST BE A MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND BAR;
10 11	(2) MUST MEET ALL OTHER QUALIFICATIONS FOR THE POSITION SET BY THE RULES OF THE CITY COUNCIL;
12 13	(3) DURING HIS OR HER TERM, IS SUBJECT TO THE RULES OF THE CITY COUNCIL THAT GENERALLY GOVERN OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE COUNCIL; AND
14 15	(4) DURING HER OR HIS TERM, MAY NOT ENGAGE IN ANY OTHER PRACTICE OF LAW UNLESS:
16 17	(I) IT IS UNCOMPENSATED AND IN THE NATURE OF COMMUNITY SERVICE, SUCH AS PRO BONO ADVICE TO OR REPRESENTATION OF INDIGENT CLIENTS; OR

21	THE GENERAL COUNSEL SERVES AT THE PLEASURE OF THE CITY COUNCIL.
22	(D) DUTIES.
23	AS THE CITY COUNSEL COUNCIL DIRECTS, THE GENERAL COUNSEL SHALL:
24 25	(1) PROVIDE INDEPENDENT LEGAL ADVICE TO THE CITY COUNCIL, ITS COMMITTEES, AND SUBCOMMITTEES, AND ITS MEMBERS;
26 27	(2) ASSIST THE CITY COUNCIL IN INVESTIGATIONS UNDERTAKEN BY THE CITY COUNCIL OR ANY OF ITS COMMITTEES OR SUBCOMMITTEES; <u>AND</u>
28 29	(3) REPRESENT THE CITY COUNCIL IN A JUDICIAL OR OTHER PROCEEDING IF THE COUNCIL IS A PARTY TO OR DESIRES TO INTERVENE IN THE PROCEEDING; AND
30	(3) (4) GENERALLY SERVE AS ATTORNEY FOR THE CITY COUNCIL.

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1	(E) COMPENSATION; EXPENSES.		
2 3	(1) THE GENERAL COUNSEL'S COMPENSATION SHALL BE AS SET BY RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL.		
4	(2) AT LEAST 30 DAYS BEFORE THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES ADOPTS ITS PROPOSED		
5	ORDINANCE OF ESTIMATES FOR THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR, THE CITY COUNCIL		
6	PRESIDENT SHALL CERTIFY TO THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT		
7	OF MONEY THAT THE PRESIDENT ESTIMATES WILL BE NEEDED DURING THE NEXT		
8	FISCAL YEAR FOR THE COMPENSATION AND RELATED EXPENSES OF THE GENERAL		
9	Counsel.		
10	(3) In the proposed Ordinance of Estimates subsequently submitted to the City		
11	COUNCIL, THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES:		
12	(I) SHALL INCLUDE AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE AGGREGATE AMOUNT CERTIFIED		
13	BY THE PRESIDENT, UP TO \$100,000; AND		
14	(II) MAY INCLUDE IN THAT APPROPRIATION ALL OR ANY PORTION OF THE AMOUNT		
15	CERTIFIED THAT EXCEEDS \$100,000.		
16	(1) THE GENERAL COUNSEL'S COMPENSATION SHALL BE AT LEAST EQUAL TO THAT OF A		
17	FULL-TIME CHIEF OF THE LAW DEPARTMENT'S GENERAL COUNSEL DIVISION.		
18	(2) THE BOARD OF ESTIMATES SHALL ANNUALLY INCLUDE IN THE ORDINANCE OF		
19	ESTIMATES SUBMITTED TO THE CITY COUNCIL AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO FUND THE		
20	GENERAL COUNSEL'S COMPENSATION AND NECESSARY EXPENSES.		
21	(3) (4) THE AMOUNT APPROPRIATED FOR THE GENERAL COUNSEL'S COMPENSATION AND		
22	EXPENSES SHALL BE IN ADDITION TO AND MAY NOT SUPPLANT, BE DEDUCTED FROM,		
23	OR SERVE AS A BASIS FOR REDUCING ANY PART OF THE OPERATING BUDGET OF THE		
24	CITY COUNCIL.

27	(c) Outside counsel.		
28	(1) The City Council, Comptroller, and, with the approval of the Mayor, a department,		
29	commission, board, or other authority, may select outside counsel to represent it if:		
30	(I) [(1)] the City Solicitor gives it written notice that representation of it by the		
31	Department of Law involves an irreconcilable conflict of interest; and		
32	(II) [(2)] the Board of Estimates authorizes the employment of outside counsel.		
33	(2) THE CITY COUNCIL ALSO MAY EMPLOY LEGAL COUNSEL AS PROVIDED IN ARTICLE III,		
34	§ 15 OF THIS CHARTER.
