Re: City Council Bill 13-0132R- Request for State Action-Strengthening Animal Laws

Dear Madame President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 12-0132R for form and legal sufficiency. This resolution calls on the Baltimore City Delegation to the Maryland General Assembly to act to strengthen our anti-animal abuse laws by securing the enactment of legislation tightening animal abuse penalties, criminalizing the trafficking of animal fighting paraphernalia, and creating a public registry of violent animal abusers.

In general, a City Council resolution is "an expression of opinion or mind concerning some particular item of business coming within the legislative body's official cognizance." Inlet Assocs. v. Assateague House Condominium Assoc., 545 A.2d 1296, 1303 (Md. 1988) (quoting McQuillin Mun. Corp. § 15:2 (3rd Ed.)). Council Bill 13-0132R is an appropriate resolution to express the Council's concerns about this particular situation

The Law Department approves Council Bill 12-0132R for form and legal sufficiency as consistent with the City Council's authority to express its views on this matter.
