10 11	<b>SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE</b> , That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:
12	Baltimore City Code
13	Article 31. Transit and Traffic
14	Subtitle 31. Clear Streets and Impoundment
15	§ 31-26. Immobilization - Release on payment of booting fee, etc.
16	(a) In general.
17	The owner of an immobilized vehicle may secure release of the vehicle on payment of:
18	(1) a booting fee of [\$100] \$150; and
19 20	(2) all charges that have accrued on the vehicle, including collateral equivalent to the maximum fines and penalties for all unsatisfied parking violation citations.

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1	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
2	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
3	Ordinance.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day after the date it is enacted.
