12	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That, in
13	accordance with Article II, § 15(c) of the City Charter, the Commissioner of Housing and
14	Community Development may sell, at either public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor
15	and City Council of Baltimore in the property known as 1315-1327 Division Street (Block 0396,
16	Lot 038), and more particularly described as follows:
17	The subject property, located in the Upton neighborhood, is a vacant building that
18	was built in 1877, and it has an enclosed area of 14,712 square feet. It originally
19	served as a school until it was surplussed to the Department of Housing and
20	Community Development.
21	This property being no longer needed for public use.
22	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance
23	unless the deed has been approved by the City Solicitor.
24	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
25	enacted.
