12 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That, in

13 accordance with Article II § 15(c) of the City Charter, the Commissioner of Housing and

14 Community Development may sell, at either public or private sale, all the interest of the Mayor

- and City Council of Baltimore in the property known as 1749-1757 Gorsuch Avenue (Block
- 16 4123, Lot 022), and more particularly described as follows:
- The subject property, located in the Coldstream Homestead Montebello
  neighborhood, is a vacant building that was formerly a firehouse. The building
  was surplussed to the Department of Housing and Community Development when
  the firehouse was closed.
- 21 This property being no longer needed for public use.
- 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no deed may pass under this Ordinance 23 unless the deed has been approved by the City Solicitor.
