11	Ken Harris, throughout his life, worked hard to uplift and improve his community		
12	in North and Northeast Baltimore. One particular focus of his efforts was his		
13	struggle to guide children onto and along the right paths of life, particularly those		
14	children in the Ramblewood Community.		
15	As a Baltimore City Councilman, he looked out for all of our City's children. He		
16	sought to keep students on the right course by championing the Baltimore Truancy		
17	Assessment Centers to counsel and provide needed social services to kids who		
18	"skip" class. He worked to change eviction procedures to keep families and		
19	children from being thrown out onto the street with their belongings. And he		
20	consistently challenged the Police Department to be prudent in charging youths		
21 22	with minor offenses that could jeopardize their future jobs and education. Perhaps most importantly, he made ending the cycle of violence on our City's streets that		
23	mars the lives of so many of our young people his signature priority.		
24	Before Ken Harris began fighting for all of Baltimore's youth as a Councilman, he		
25	worked tirelessly to support the children of his neighborhood through his service
