1 2 3	(a) for the 1 st year following the effective date of this Ordinance, the devices required by this Ordinance need be provided only to patrol officers newly hired during that year by the Baltimore City Police Department; but
4 5 6	(b) beginning on the 1st anniversary of the effective date of this Ordinance, the devices required by this Ordinance must be provided to all police officers employed by the Baltimore City Police Department.
7 8 9	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
10 11	SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day after the date it is enacted.
