11 12 13	(8) [(7)] temporary signs in connection with civic non-commercial health, art, safety, and welfare campaigns, but the sponsoring organization must remove them promptly at the conclusion of the campaign.
14 15 16	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED , That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
