I am herein reporting on City Council Bill 14-0422, for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in certain property known as 5000 Gwynn Oak Avenue (Block8308, Lot 001) and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

If this bill is enacted, it would authorize the Mayor and City Council to sell the surplus property at 5000 Gwynn Oak Avenue in the Howard Park neighborhood so it can be returned to productive use. It is an irregularly shaped lot within an R-2 Zoning District and is improved with a single story school annex building. The City acquired the property by a deed dated July 18th, 1969 from Ida E. Metcalfe for use by the school system until it was no longer needed and then transferred to HCD as surplus property. There is interest by a developer to purchase the lot for the construction of a new home in the community.

DOT has no objections to the passage of this bill. Thank you for this opportunity to comment.
