**AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING**

**1 City Property – Naming a Portion of the Stony Run Walking Path to be the**  
**2 Adam D. Cockey, Jr. Walking Path in Stony Run Park**

3 FOR the purpose of naming a portion of the Stony Run Walking Path, located in Stony Run Park,  
4 to be the Adam D. Cockey, Jr. Walking Path in Stony Run Park.

**10 Recitals**

11 Adam D. Cockey, Jr., was a person who made a difference. Active in  
12 philanthropy, he served as a past board and executive committee member of the  
13 League for the Disabled and was a past president of the Cystic Fibrosis  
14 Foundation. To quote his business partner, Carol J. Schmidt, “Adam had a sense  
15 of humor. He was kind and genuine. He cared about people and causes and was  
16 respected statewide and nationally.”

17 As the owner of Wyndhurst Station, he was an important steward of a key  
18 commercial property that is located adjacent to the Stony Run Park in the Greater  
19 Roland Park area of Baltimore City. He maintained the historic appearance of the  
20 14,000 square foot property, which was originally built as a station house for the  
21 Maryland and Pennsylvania Railroad.

22 When he acquired the property, he provided a public easement for the Stony  
23 Run Park and Walking Path. In 2011, he agreed to donate the land to the City to  
24 be made a permanent part of the Stony Run Park, but sadly passed away before  
25 the land could be transferred. His wife and son agreed to donate the property in  
26 his honor.

**Council Bill 14-0446**

1       **SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE,** That a  
2 portion of the Walking Path in Stony Run Park, beginning at the Coordinates 39.35666 Degrees  
3 North and 76.63051 Degrees West (beginning approximately where the end of Deepdene Road  
4 joins the Park) to the Coordinates 39.35426 Degrees North and 76.62987 Degrees West (ending  
5 approximately where the end of Gladstone Avenue and Wilmslow Road joins the Park) is named  
6 the Adam D. Cockey, Jr. Walking Path in Stony Run Park.

7       **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED,** That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30<sup>th</sup> day  
8 after the date it is enacted.
