AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

Plastic Bag Surcharge Reduction

FOR the purpose of imposing a surcharge on certain bags provided by dealers to customers;	
prohibiting certain dealers from supplying customers with plastic bags for use as checkout or	
carryout bags; authorizing certain exemptions; defining certain terms; providing for the	
collection and remittance of the surcharge; requiring certain reports; prohibiting certain	
conduct; imposing certain civil and criminal penalties; repealing the Plastic Bag Reduction	
Program; and providing for a special effective date; and generally relating to a surcharge on	
plastic bags .
