Employees' Retirement System – Retirement Savings Plan Clarifications

The Department of Human Resources ("DHR") has reviewed City Council Bill 14-0457 Employees' Retirement System – Retirement Savings Plan – Clarifications (the "Bill"), which proposes several changes to Article 22 Employee Retirement System and Article 22A Retirement Savings Plan. Following are DHR's remarks relative to each of the proposed changes:

Article 22 - Employee Retirement Systems ("ERS")

- The Bill establishes that Class D ERS members who terminate employment before vesting and receive the value of their accumulated contributions before reemployment must purchase their prior City service to have it credited.
- A requirement that an employee's service must be terminated for more than 30 consecutive days before the reemployment rules apply was added to Section 9.2(1)(2) making it consistent with existing Class C reemployment rules.

DHR supports the proposed changes to Article 22.

Article 22A - Retirement Savings Plan ("RSP")

- The Bill adds language that specifically characterizes the RSP as a Profit Sharing Plan under Internal Revenue Code § 401(a).
- The Bill modifies The Board of Trustees as follows:
  - o Expands the Board of Trustees from 12 to 14 members
  - o Increases the number of voting members from 9 to 11
  - o Adds three members representing the Baltimore City Public School System
  - O Reduces the number of Mayoral appointees from 4 to 3
  - o Increases from 5 to 6 the number of members constituting a quorum.
- Clarifies the formula used to determine the City's match of certain employee contributions to the Deferred Compensation Plan.

- The Bill allows members to make investment elections for non-vested employer contributions.
- The Bill will make the account balance of a member who dies while performing "qualified military service" 100% vested as if the member died while an active employee of the City of Baltimore.

DHR supports the proposed changes to Article 22A.
