## AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING

### City Streets – Closing – A Portion of Creek Alley

- 2 FOR the purpose of condemning and closing a portion of Creek Alley, extending from West West
- 3 Street Northeasterly 330 feet, more or less to West Cross Street, as shown on Plat 257-A-39A
- in the Office of the Department of General Services; and providing for a special effectivedate.

#### 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the

- 15 Department of General Services shall proceed to condemn and close a portion of Creek Alley,
- 16 extending from West West Street Northeasterly 330 feet, more or less, to West Cross Street, and 17 more particularly described as follows:

Beginning for Parcel No. 1 at the point formed by the intersection of the southeast 18 19 side of West Cross Street 66 feet wide, and the southeast side of Creek Alley 20 feet wide, the point of beginning being distant Northwesterly 155 feet, more or 20 21 less, measured along the southeast side of West Cross Street, from the northwest side of Race Street 66 feet wide, and running thence binding on the southeast side 22 of Creek Alley Southwesterly 330 feet, more or less, to intersect the northeast side 23 of West West Street, thence binding on the northeast side of West West Street 24 Northwesterly 20 feet, to the northwest side of Creek Alley, thence binding on the 25 northwest side of the alley, Northeasterly 330 feet, more or less, to intersect the 26 27 southwest side of West Cross Street, and thence binding on the southwest side of West Cross Street Southeasterly 20 feet to the place of beginning. 28

**SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, That the proceedings for the condemnation and closing of Creek Alley, extending from West West Street northeasterly 330 feet, more or less, to West Cross Street, and the rights of all interested parties shall be regulated by and in accordance with all applicable provisions of state and local law and with all applicable rules and regulations adopted by the Director of General Services and filed with the Department of Legislative Reference.

- 9 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all 10 subsurface structures and appurtenances now owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore 11 continue to be the property of the Mayor and City Council, in fee simple, until their use has been 12 abandoned by the Mayor and City Council. If any person wants to remove, alter, or interfere with 13 them, that person must first obtain permission from the Mayor and City Council and, in the 14 application for this permission, must agree to pay all costs and expenses, of every kind, arising 15 out of the removal, alteration, or interference.
- 16 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That no building or structure of any kind 17 (including but not limited to railroad tracks) may be constructed or erected in or on any part of 18 the Creek Alley closed under this Ordinance until all subsurface structures and appurtenances 19 owned by the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore have been abandoned by the Mayor and City 20 Council or, at the expense of the person seeking to erect the building or structure, have been 21 removed and relaid in accordance with the specifications and under the direction of the Director 22 of General Services of Baltimore City.
- SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That after the closing under this Ordinance, all
  subsurface structures and appurtenances owned by any person other than the Mayor and City
  Council of Baltimore shall be removed by and at the expense of their owners, promptly upon
  notice to do so from the Director of Public Works.
- SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That at all times after the closing under this Ordinance, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, acting by or through its authorized representatives, shall have access to the subject property and to all subsurface structures and appurtenances used by the Mayor and City Council, for the purpose of inspecting, maintaining, repairing, altering, relocating, or replacing any of them, without need to obtain permission from or pay compensation to the owner of the property.
- SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the date it is
  enacted.
