> City Council Bill 15-0481 - Transit and Traffic - Impeding Traffic by School Re:

Grounds

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 15-0481 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill increases the fine, without providing prior warning, for vehicles that park, stop, or stand in a manner that obstructs or impedes the free flow of traffic by school grounds during certain hours. The bill also clarifies, corrects and conforms related language.

City Council Bill 15-0481 creates an offense which is within the City's authority to establish under the Maryland Vehicle Law, see Md. Transp. Code Ann., § 25-102(a)(1), and is consistent with the City's powers under the Charter to regulate the use of streets and public ways and to establish fines for violations of City ordinances. See Baltimore City Charter, Art. II, §§ 34(d), 48. Therefore, the Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
