5	special effective date; and generally relating to the imposition of fines for obstructing or		
6	impeding the free flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic.

17	SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the		
18	Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

2	(3) PARKING, STOPPING, OR STANDING IN A MANNER THAT OBSTRUCTS OR IMPEDES THE FREE		
3	FLOW OF VEHICULAR OR PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC ALONG A BLOCK FACE ABUTTING OR		
4	IMMEDIATELY ACROSS THE STREET FROM THE GROUNDS OF A BUILDING USED AS A PUBLIC		
5	OR PRIVATE KINDERGARTEN, ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, OR SECONDARY SCHOOL, ON ANY		
6	SCHOOL DAY BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 7 A.M AND 9 A.M. OR BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 2 P.M.		
7	AND 4 P.M., IS PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF \$250.

9	(3) (i) Parking, stopping, or standing in [such] a manner [as to obstruct or impede] THAT		
10	OBSTRUCTS OR IMPEDES the free flow of vehicular or pedestrian traffic is punishable		
1	by a fine of \$100, subject to the requirements of subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph		
12	(3).		
13	(ii) (A) Except as provided in sub-subparagraph (B) of this subparagraph (ii), the		
14	Transportation Department may not issue a citation for this offense unless:		
15	1. [(1)] it first issues a written warning, ordering the obstruction or		
16	impediment to be removed within 15 minutes of the warning; and		
17	2. [(2)] the [impediment or] obstruction OR IMPEDIMENT is not removed		
18	within the specified time.		
19	(B) This subparagraph (ii) does not apply, and a citation may be issued without a prio		
20	warning, on a street marked as a snow emergency route, at any time between the		
21	hours of 7 a.m and 9:30 a.m. or BETWEEN the hours of 4 p.m. and 6 p.m.		
22	(iii) This paragraph (3) does not apply to an obstruction or impediment:		
23	(A) within an intersection or a marked crosswalk or by a commercial vehicle, as		
23 24	provided in § 36-4(2) of this subtitle; OR		
	pro-1200 in 3 00 (2) or time eactive, or		
25	(B) ALONG A BLOCK FACE ABUTTING OR ACROSS FROM THE GROUNDS OF A SCHOOL, AS		
26	PROVIDED IN § 36-4(3) OF THIS SUBTITLE.		
27	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance		
28	are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior		
29	Ordinance.		
30	SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That this Ordinance takes effect on the 30 th day		
31	after the date it is enacted.
