SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

 - SUBTITLE 36. COMMEMORATIVE DAYS
- 16 **§ 36-1. BALTIMORE DAY**.
- AUGUST 8 OF EACH YEAR SHALL BE BALTIMORE DAY IN HONOR OF BALTIMORE'S FOUNDING
 ON AUGUST 8, 1729. THE MAYOR ANNUALLY SHALL PROCLAIM THIS DAY AS BALTIMORE
 DAY, TO RECOGNIZE THIS IMPORTANT MOMENT IN THE CITY'S HISTORY.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance
 are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior
 Ordinance.
