City Council Bill No. 15-0523

Poppleton Special Taxing District

The Baltimore Development Corporation (BDC) has reviewed City Council Bill 15-0523, designating a "special taxing district" to be known as the "Poppleton Special Taxing District". The Bill will also establish a special fund into which the special taxes levied in the special taxing district are deposited. The Bill also authorizes the City, subject to certain requirements, to borrow money by issuing and selling bonds for the purpose of financing, refinancing, or reimbursement for the cost of infrastructure improvements. The Bill also provides for the levy of an ad valorem or special tax on all real and personal property in the special taxing district at a rate or amount designed to provide adequate revenues to repay on the bonds, replenish any debt service reserve funds, or for other related ongoing expenses of or security for the bonds.

As a companion bill to City Council Bill 15-0522 and City Council Bill 15-0523, all three Bills will establish the Poppleton Special Taxing District; will establish a tax increment fund for this district; will provide for the issuance of bonds from time to time, and the pledge of amounts, subject to appropriation, on deposit in the tax increment fund to the payment of debt service on and other costs related to any bonds; all for the purpose of providing funds for the financing and refinancing of a portion of the costs of the future project which accomplishes the purpose of the act, serves public purposes, including the direct and indirect enhancement of the taxable base of the City, the creation of new employment opportunities, the encouragement of additional economic activities, the development or redevelopment of slum, blighted or deteriorated areas, the undertaking of urban renewal projects, and the facilitation of planned improvements to the development district, and generally promotes the health, welfare, and safety of the residents of the State of Maryland and of the City of Baltimore.

The BDC recommends favorable consideration and passage of City Council Bill 15-0523.
