Re: City Council Bill 15-0517 - Sale of Property - Air Rights over a

Portion of a 10-Foot Alley in the Rear of 435-439 East Lafayette

Avenue

The Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 15-0517, for the purpose of authorizing the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to sell, at either public or private sale, all its interest in the air rights over a portion of a 10-foot alley in the rear of 435-439 East Lafayette Avenue, extending westerly 56 feet, more or less, from Greenmount Avenue and no longer needed for public use; and providing for a special effective date.

If enacted, this bill would authorizing the sale of certain air rights above an alley bed to support the development of five townhomes and a 60-unit apartment building along Greenmount Avenue. There are two pieces of companion legislation, City Council Bill 15-0515 which would condemn and open the air rights and City Council Bill 15-0516 which would close the condemned and opened air rights above the alley bed.

The proposed development, which is known as City Arts II, is the second phase of the City Arts development located on the 1500 block of Greenmount Avenue. The property over a portion of an alley is needed for the development to provide the necessary clearance for vehicular access and utility maintenance.

The Department of Housing and Community Development supports and recommends the passage of City Council Bill 15-0517.
