Re: City Council Bill 15-0515 – City Streets – Opening – Air Rights over a Portion of a 10-Foot Alley in the Rear of 435-439 Lafayette Avenue

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 15-0515 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would allow the City to open the air rights over a portion of an alley at the rear of 435-439 Lafayette Avenue.

Section (34) of Article II of the City Charter grants the Mayor and City Council the power to "construct, open, extend, widen, straighten or close streets, bridges, tunnels or approaches to them and other public ways of every kind within the bounds of the City." Generally "ownership of space above lands and waters is vested in the owners of the surface." See, e.g., Macht v. Department of Assessments, 266 Md. 602, 604 (1972). Section 116(b)(2) of Article VII of the City Charter requires that the Department of General Services ("DGS") prepare all ordinances for the opening and closing of streets. See Ordinance 08-0003 (transferring this power to DGS from the Department of Transportation), approved by the voters. Thus, this is the appropriate bill to effectuate the opening of the air rights over a portion of this alley. The Law Department approves it for form and legal sufficiency.
