Dear President and City Council Members:

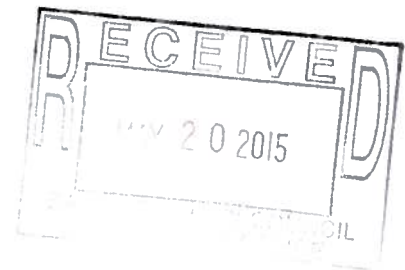
The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 15-0519 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill would allow the City to condemn and close certain alleys and portions of streets and alleys located behind Brentwood Avenue that it no longer needs.

Section (34) of Article II of the City Charter grants the Mayor and City Council the power to “construct, open, extend, widen, straighten or close streets, bridges, tunnels or approaches to them and other public ways of every kind within the bounds of the City.” Section 166(b)(2) of Article VII of the City Charter requires the Department of General Services to prepare all ordinances for the opening and closing of streets. See Ordinance 08-0003 (transferring this power to DGS from the Department of Transportation), approved by the voters.

As this bill meets with the applicable sections of the Charter, the Law Department approves it for form and legal sufficiency.
