Development District

Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 15-0586 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill proposes to designate the University of Maryland Baltimore BioPark Development District in accordance with the City Charter as it was recently amended by the General Assembly to allow for this type of economic incentive. 2014 Md. Laws, Ch. 530, 531 §1 (codified in City Charter, Art. II, §§ (62)(1), (62A)(u)); see also Kimball-Tyler co. v. Baltimore, 214 Md. 86, 94 (1957)(Article II of the City Charter is state law enacted only by the General Assembly).

These state laws allow the City to use the process in Sections (62) and (62A) of the City Charter for a Regional Institution Strategic Enterprise ("RISE") Zone. City Charter, Art. II, §§ (62)(1), (62A)(u))(adding RISE incentive "in addition to the powers" already granted in these sections). A development district must be designated by ordinance, and such a district is a prerequisite to the issuance of bonds for RISE zone projects. City Charter, Art. II, §§ (62)(b)(10), (62)(d)(1).

Since this bill is consistent with the City's authority in Section (62) of Article II of the City Charter, as modified by the state economic development laws on RISE zones, the Law Department approves it for form and legal sufficiency.
