Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 16-0635 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill provides a Supplementary General Fund Operating Appropriation in the amount of \$1,200,000 to the Police Department of Baltimore City. The source of the funds is the assigned General Fund balance. The bill is effective on the date it is enacted.

The City Charter establishes the criteria for making supplementary appropriations. City Section 8(b)(3) of Article VI of the City Charter permits such a Charter, Art. VI, §8. supplementary appropriation when there has been "a material change in circumstance or additional appropriations for new programs which could not reasonably be anticipated at the time of the formulation of the proposed Ordinance of Estimates" for Fiscal Year 2016. supplementary appropriation must be recommended by the Board of Estimates and must be approved by the Mayor and City Council via an ordinance, which must identify the source of the funds and may only encompass a "single program, purpose, activity or project." Although the Police Department is a state agency, state law requires following similar budget and appropriation processes as municipal agencies. Public Local Laws, §§16-2, 16-7, 16-8. The Law Department approves this bill for form and legal sufficiency.
