The Department of Planning is in receipt of City Council Bill #16-0648, Street Encroachment – 1 West North Avenue (Parkway Theatre), for the purpose of permitting, subject to certain conditions, the construction and maintenance of a portion of a building that will project into the public right-of-way of North Charles Street on the east side of the property known as 1 West North Avenue; and providing for a special effective date.

This bill would grant permission for construction and maintenance of a portion of a building on the east side of the property known as 1 West North Avenue, the portion of the building extending into the public right-of-way of North Charles Street, provided that the structure may not project into the public right-of-way more than 3 feet; and further provided that all ordinances, rules, and regulations of the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, including but not limited to the requirement to obtain a right-of-entry permit, must be complied with in the construction and maintenance of the structure.

The Parkway Theatre redevelopment project includes creation of a 3-screen movie theatre with exterior signs. The encroachment proposed is needed to allow adequate interior space meeting all code requirements for this use. The incorporation of the property known as 1 West North Avenue into the larger property known as 3-9 West North Avenue, which is the original site of the Parkway Theatre, will permit modernization of a designated Baltimore City Landmark in order to facilitate its re-use as an arts and entertainment center for the 21st Century. The site is also within the Charles/ North Revitalization Area Urban Renewal Plan area, in which the use to be facilitated by the encroachment authorized by this bill would be a positive contributor. The proposed redevelopment as a whole would support the City's Comprehensive Master Plan PLAY Goal 1: Enhance the Enjoyment, Appreciation, and Stewardship of Baltimore's Historical and Cultural Resources.

The Department of Planning recommends approval of City Council Bill #16-0648, as it would allow development of an enlarged Parkway Theatre arts and entertainment center.
