At its regular meeting of February 9, 2016 the Commission for Historical and Architectural Preservation (CHAP) considered the designation of the Apostolic Faith Church of God Building, located at 1939 Walbrook Ave., as a Baltimore City Landmark.

After hearing the staff report on the matter and reviewing the attached landmark designation report, the Commission moved to approve staff recommendation to approve landmark designation because the proposed designation meets Guideline *5.1 Criteria for Designating Districts and Landmarks* as the structure meets Criteria 1 for its association with events that have made a significant contribution to the broad patterns of Baltimore history, and Criteria 3 for its embodiment of the distinctive characteristics of a type, period, or method of construction, or that represent the work of a master, or that possess high artistic values, or that represent a significant and distinguishable entity whose components may lack individual distinction.
