> City Council Bill 16-0629 - Conditional Use Convalescent, Nursing, and Re:

Rest Home – 300-306 W. Fayette St.


Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 16-0629 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill permits the establishment, maintenance, and operation of a Convalescent, Nursing and Rest Home at 300-306 W. Fayette St.

The property is zoned B-4-2. The conditional uses that require approval by ordinance in an R-4-2 zone include convalescent, nursing and rest homes. City Zoning Code ("ZC"), § 6-509. This bill is the required legislative authorization for this type of use in this zone. A bill concerning a conditional use is classified as a "legislative authorization." ZC § 16-101. Legislative authorizations require that certain procedures be followed in the bill's passage. Specifically, certain notice requirements apply to the introduction of the bill. See ZC § 16-203. The bill must be referred to certain City agencies, which are obligated to review the bill in a specified manner. See ZC §§ 16-301, 16-302, 16-304. Additional public notice and hearing requirements also apply to the bill. See ZC § 16-402. Finally, certain limitations on the City Council's ability to amend the bill apply. See ZC § 16-403.

As required by The Zoning Code §16-301, the bill was referred to the Planning Commission. The Planning Commission made recommendations based on the required findings to support the approval of this conditional use. See Planning Commission Report on CC 16-0629 and ZC §§ 16-304, 14-204 and 14-205.

Assuming all the procedural requirements are met and the required findings and considerations are approved by City Council, the Law Department will approve the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
