- SECTION 1. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE, That the 25 26 Laws of Baltimore City read as follows:

3	Title 7. Waste Control
4	Subtitle 5. [Wastewater from] Hydraulic Fracturing
5	§ 7-502. Hydraulic fracturing prohibited
6 7	NO PERSON MAY MAKE USE OF HYDRAULIC FRACTURING TO EXTRACT OIL, GAS, OR OTHER HYDROCARBONS WITHIN THE CITY OF BALTIMORE.
8	§ 7-503. [§ 7-502.] Storing, treating, disposing, etc., wastewater prohibited.
9 10 11	No person may store, treat, discharge, or dispose of in the City or in or on any City-owned facility or property, wherever situated, any flow back or other wastewater resulting from hydraulic fracturing.
12	§ 7-504. [§ 7-503.] Penalties: \$1,000 and 90 days.
13	(a) In general.
14 15 16	Any person who violates any provision of this subtitle is guilty of a misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine of not more than \$1,000, imprisonment for not more than 90 days, or both fine and imprisonment for each offense.
17	(b) Each day a separate offense.
18	Each day that a violation continues is a separate offense.
19 20 21	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, That the catchlines contained in this Ordinance are not law and may not be considered to have been enacted as a part of this or any prior Ordinance.
