Dear President and City Council Members:

The Law Department has reviewed City Council Bill 16-0710 for form and legal sufficiency. The bill amends the Urban Renewal Plan for Mondawmin Transit Station to correct Exhibit 1, "Land Use Plan," to conform the land use designation of the property known as 2700 Reisterstown Road to the property's existing zoning district classification. The bill also waives certain content and procedural requirements, makes the provisions of this Ordinance severable, provides for the application of this Ordinance in conjunction with certain other ordinances, and provides for an immediate effective date.

Article 13, Section 2-6(g)(1) of the Baltimore City Code requires that any change to an Urban Renewal Plan be made by ordinance. As this is the appropriate mechanism for making changes to the Plan, the Law Department approves the bill for form and legal sufficiency.
