Re: City Council Bill 16-0698 - Baltimore City Landmark List: Exteriors

George W. King/Abraham Briscoe House

The Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) has reviewed City Council Bill 16-0698, for the purpose of designating the George W. King/Abraham Briscoe House, 1232 Druid Hill Avenue, as an historical landmark: exterior.

If enacted, this bill would recognize the historical significance of the George W. King/Abraham Briscoe House, which was owned by the founder of Kings Brothers printer, the official printer for Baltimore City government in the mid-to-late 1900s. Mr. King also served as the Councilman for Ward 7 in 1872 and 1873. The property is also being recognized for its role as a place that held numerous fundraising events to support the advancement of civil rights in the early-mid 20<sup>th</sup> century.

The Department of Housing and Community Development supports the passage of City Council Bill 16-0698.
